#### Grant Highlight: Classroom Libraries Foster Love of Reading

The mini-grants teachers request take many forms. Last spring's range from mini-robots for teaching coding and programming to an orchestra seminar with visiting musicians that has the catchy title, "You Had Me at Cello!"

Last fall, the Foundation granted a more conventional—though no less important—request from Middle School English teacher Andrea Adams for new books for her classroom library.

"The best way to become a better reader is to read," Adams wrote in her grant application. "Updating my classroom library will encourage students to read more. Students love checking books out from a classroom library! This allows me opportunities to instill a love for reading in every student."

Students love the new books in their classroom library. Middle School student George Murphy says, "Classroom libraries are useful because they bring you books you might not find other places."

Another Middle School student, Myatt Butler, says, "Kids can pick up a book whenever they want and know right away if it's something they want to read."

Macy Brown is also grateful for the new books. "It's convenient to have a teacher classroom library," she says. "If I forget a book, I don't have to go to the Learning Commons to get another one."







#### Students, Teachers Awarded Scholarships

Every year, the Foundation funds scholarships for students and teachers. This year the Foundation awarded three student scholarships and six teacher scholarships.

The East Grand Rapids Schools Foundation Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a high school senior who shows commitment to education and community and has strong aspirations and goals for the future. This year's recipient, **Shannon Ors**, will be attending the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

The Ridenour Scholarship is a student scholarship that funds \$900 for post-secondary educational costs. This scholarship is awarded to a student who exemplifies the character traits for which Chip B. Ridenour Jr. is most remembered: caring, nurturing, and regard for the dignity of an individual. The recipient of this year's Ridenour Scholarship was **Macie Zack**. Macie will be attending Michigan State University in East Lansing.

The third student scholarship awarded last spring was the Reid VanGelderen Scholarship. This scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship for post-secondary education given to a high school student who has displayed moral character, integrity, and academic excellence, all while facing personal or family adversity. Our recipient this year, **Tyler Morrill**, will attend Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.

The last group of scholarships awarded are teacher scholarships that are funded by the William O. VandenBerg Scholarship Fund. These scholarships are given annually to one or more EGR staff to be used for a class, seminar or workshop that will directly enhance the quality of teaching in that person's current academic area.

Thanks to the generosity of the VandenBerg family, we were able to fund scholarships totaling over \$5,100 to six teachers. This year's recipients were **Kim Doele** for attendance at the National Council of Teachers of English conference, **Brian VanderBee** for attendance at the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics conference, **Becky Martin** for study at the Cornell University honey bee extension program, **Adam Horos** for attendance at the National Academy for Civics and Government, and **Vikki Boersma** and **Katherine Vicente** for a teacher exchange with the Power of Education School in Haiti.

Congratulations to all of our student and staff scholarship recipients! The deadline for nominations for this year's student scholarships is May 1, 2018.

#### The L. Neesley Legacy Society: Linda Kehm

Linda Kehm made an enormous positive difference in our schools. She devoted her entire professional career to educating children. And even though she passed away in December 2015 after battling cancer, she'll continue to help children and our schools through a planned gift she made to the East Grand Rapids Schools Foundation's Legacy Society.

For more than 20 years, Kehm served as the principal at Lakeside Elementary School. During that time, she mentored countless students and developed dozens of outstanding teachers.

"Linda was a consummate educator and believed that every child could learn and that they especially needed to experience the joy of reading," says East Grand Rapids Public Schools Superintendent Sara Shubel. "Ask any current or former Lakeside Lion what the school motto is and I am confident that they would immediately respond.... "Lakeside Elementary, Where Kindness Counts' and 'Read a Zillion Books!"

Before she died, Kehm made one last important, generous decision to help the community she served. She left a substantial portion of her retirement funds to the East Grand Rapids Schools Foundation Legacy Society.

The Society, which was recently named in honor of longtime East Grand Rapids resident Louise Neesley, is a way for people to give to the Foundation at the time of their death through planned giving. The L. Neesley Legacy Society will help East Grand Rapids students for generations to come, just as Linda Kehm wanted.


